Art UHCL Transfer Plan

This plan includes course options for transferring into an Art and Design BFA at UHCL. The plan includes less than the 60 hours required for an Associate of Arts. Students must complete additional associates degree requirements or use reverse transfer to complete their Associate of Arts. Upon transfer, students may be required to submit a portfolio of their creative work for review, acceptance, and placement.
