If a student commits an infrac- pr engages in misconduct, the College District may impose for more of the following penaltiessanctions:
		Reprimand — A verbal or written warning to the student fol- lowing a rule violation. Repetition of such misconduct may re- sult in more severe disciplinary action.
		Restitution — Reimbursement for damage to or misappropria- tion of property. Reimbursement may take the form of appro- priate service to repair or otherwise compensate for damage.
		Scholastic penalties — Range from a zero on an assignment to suspension. Academic dishonesty and corresponding pen- alties are defined and outlined in the online College District catalog.
		Conditional Probation — Placing a student on notice that con- tinued infraction of regulations may result in suspension or ex- pulsion from the College District. Conditional probation may include restrictions on a student's rights and privileges or specified community service. The probation may be for a specified length of time or for an indefinite period according to the relative severity of the infraction or misconduct. Failure to fulfill the terms of the probation may lead to suspension or ex- pulsion.
		Suspension — Forced withdrawal from the College District for either a definite period of time or until stated conditions have been met. Suspensions may extend from the remainder of the term through one year, at which time, upon request of the stu- dent, his or her status will be reevaluated by the vice presi- dent of student affairs or designee in conjunction with other College District administrators, as appropriate.
		Expulsion — Permanent forced withdrawal from the College District. A student receiving disciplinary expulsion shall have the action noted in the student's permanent record.
		No Trespass Notice — Issued in cooperation with campus se- curity and local law enforcement. If a no trespass notice is vi- olated, a student may receive a criminal trespass order.

Suspended or Expelled Students	No former student who has been suspended or expelled from the College District for disciplinary reasons shall be permitted on the campus or other facilities of the College District, initiated into an honorary or service organization, or permitted to receive credit for academic work done in residence or by correspondence or extension during the period of suspension or expulsion without the prior written approval of the College President or designee. <u>A Student Conduct Administrator (SCA) or their designee has the authority to remove a suspended or expelled student from campus by coordinating with Campus Security, Athletic/Housing Staff, and/or other relevant campus partners as needed.</u>
<u>Emergency</u> <u>Removals</u>	A Student Conduct Administrator (SCA) or their designee may take immediate action to suspend a student from the College and re- move the student from designated College spaces when the SCA reasonably believes that the continued presence of the student would constitute a danger to safety of the campus community or College property. The suspension and associated restrictions are temporary pending the resolution of the student's conduct case.
Disciplinary Record	The College District shall maintain, for every student alleged or de- termined to have committed misconduct at the College District, a disciplinary record that shall reflect the charge, the disposition of the charge, the sanction assessed, if any, and any other pertinent information. The disciplinary record <u>is held separately from other</u> <u>educational recordsshall be separate from the student's academic</u> <u>record and shall be treated as confidential</u> ; the contents <u>of the dis- ciplinary record</u> shall not be available except on request of the stu- dent or in accordance with applicable state or federal laws.
	The disciplinary record shall be maintained permanently in the event that a student is expelled or subject to an extended suspension. In all other cases, the disciplinary record shall be maintained in accordance with the College District's record retention schedule.
Publication	Information regarding student discipline described in College Dis- trict policies and accompanying procedures shall be published <u>and/or referenced</u> in the College District's catalog.
